Wyoming's Trial Courts Go Electronic

Cheyenne, WY – All trial courts now have documents that are stored electronically, moving one step closer to public access to court records. The multi-year project implementing a new case management system in Wyoming's trial courts kicked off in 2016. The Wyoming Judicial Branch targeted one jurisdiction at a time, with the initial focus on circuit courts. The first circuit court, Natrona County, went live on the system in October 2018, and the final district court implementation occurred this week in Carbon County. As each court rolled out, rigorous trainings were provided to judicial officers and clerical staff by the Software Applications Division of the Administrative Office of the Courts.

The Wyoming Judicial Branch recognizes the time and effort required to complete the project. Collaborative work between the trial courts, administrative staff, and the clerks of district courts made the implementation of the robust new system a success. The uniform electronic storage system is the platform for implementation of efiling, which has been rolled out in the Chancery Court and seven district courts, and will continue until all of Wyoming's trial courts have efiling capabilities, by the end of 2026.
